Happenings at the school – Jane Alexander

- Principal's report:

Second semester this school year will see the return of grade 10 Rhythm & Dance course taught by Mrs. Mecredi, as well as, a <u>new</u> grade 12 Outdoor Education course under the direction of Mrs. Rush.

What's on in The Arts

- Educational research continues to confirm that 'The Arts' is a rich & rewarding subject domain, with legitimate employment opportunities, develops an appreciation for culture, helps students discover skills & talents that foster positive self-esteem & even contributes to student success in other subject area's.
- The Arts is an inclusive subject area, involving all of educational program area's; adaptive & system classes (Physical Support Program, General Learning Program & Autism). Our cast of talented Arts Teachers are; Mr. Brown (music), Mr. Crew (drama) & Mrs. Williams (visual arts).

5. Therapy Dogs at OTSS

- The fallowing proposal is for a Therapy Dog at OTSS and submitted by Sarah Rush
- A Pilot Program in the Behaviour Intervention Program

The Facts

- Fact: Varied academic research suggests that education programs involving dogs help students with the developments of social skills and communication. Working with dogs teaches patience and builds empathy
- Fact: Caring for animals can improve self-esteem, alleviate anxiety and depression, improve social skills, and foster verbal and nonverbal communication
- Fact: Animals can be used as sources for motivation and behviour management for students who are receiving special education services for their emotional distress.

Students with a history of non-attendance and truancy benefit from building relationships with classroom dogs and thereby potentially re-engaging in school.

Perceived Benefits

- Student's attitudes towards school will improve
- Students will find companionship with the dog
- Students will use the dog to remain in control of their emotions and behaviours
- Students will use the dog as a de-escalation tool to calm their minds and bodies

Implementation

- Conduct preliminary meetings with administrators, parents, classroom paraprofessionals and students for the following reasons: a) briefly explain idea and goals, b) to gain initial support and c) to learn of dog related allergies or phobias.
- Select a dog In this case it would be staff member Sarah Rushs' 3 year old, Pyrenees-Retriever mix. "Fozzy" is fully vaccinated, has zero history of aggression, is very well socialized with kids of all ages and has been recommended for the Ottawa Dog Therapy program.
- Establish Classroom Policies and Behaviours

The staff of the Behaviour Intervention Program will collaborate with school administrators to develop classroom policies and procedures. There will be a team meeting with the classroom paraprofessionals to solicit their ideas and concerns.
